

A two-queen many-tier hive consists of a brood part divided by the vertical wall with a netted window and shop extensions separated from the brood part by the Henemann grates. The hive is completed with honeycomb frames, which are fixed on the support lath by the fore shoulder and on the suspended beam by the rare shoulder made as a hook. In the upper part of the hive feed boxes are placed which from the rare wall are equipped by spouts, which serve as ventiducts simultaneously, and also for pouring liquid without opening the hive. In the lower part of the hive under the brood section a drawer with flight board and entrance is placed, which is equipped with a pollen collector. At the time of bee wintering the drawer is blocked from the rare wall that provides the rational ventilation of the hive.
